Our Host, The Honorable Kay Coles James

Kay Coles James, The Gloucester Institute's Founder and President, has enjoyed a long and distinguished career as a public servant at the local, state, and federal levels of government. She served as the Director for the United States Office of Personnel Management under President George W. Bush from 2001 to 2005 where she led a department of 3,600 employees.

She also served in the administrations of President Ronald Reagan, President George H. W. Bush and Virginia Governor George Allen, as well as leadership positions in the corporate, nonprofit, and academic arena. She currently serves on the Board of Trustees of the Heritage Foundation in Washington, D.C.

Today, Mrs. James is the Founder and President of The Gloucester Institute, an organization which trains and nurtures leaders in the African American community. The Gloucester Institute is committed to providing an intellectually safe environment where ideas can be discussed and transformed into practical solutions that produce results. It is one of America's foremost training centers preparing young men and women for leadership positions in our Country.



She is the author of three books: her award-winning autobiography *Never Forget* (1993); *Transforming America from the Inside Out* (1995); and *What I Wish I'd Known Before I Got Married* (2001).

Holly Knoll

Holly Knoll was built in 1935 by Dr. Robert Russa Moton, the second President of the Tuskegee Institute. Dr. Moton lived at Holly Knoll in retirement and launched its long history of welcoming leaders of the African American political, intellectual, and entertainment community.

At Holly Knoll everyone, regardless of philosophical leaning, was treated as equals. Any idea offered with the sincere mission of improving the lives of African Americans would be considered. The United Negro College Fund was conceived there in 1944 and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. retreated there. It is said that he penned portions of his famous “I have a Dream” speech under Holly Knoll’s 400 year-old live oak. After Dr. Moton’s death in 1940, his son-in-law Frederick Patterson established the Moton Conference Center to continue Dr. Moton’s work in education. Under Patterson Holly Knoll was expanded into a full conference center by adding residential space and training facilities.
